The Key to Answered Prayer Lesson 2

Life Reference: Matthew 4:1-11

Focus Verse:

"It is written" (Matthew 4:4).

Have you ever wondered why there are so many different religions? Who is right? Don't we all read the same Bible?

Some denominations believe that a prayer of repentance is all that is necessary to receive salvation. Others place emphasis on baptism. Today, many people understand that there is only one God (see Deuteronomy 6:4). Many have also received the gift of the Holy Spirit as experienced by those in Acts 2:38.



It is not up to us to select the parts of the Bible that fit our lifestyle. The Scriptures warn us to "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling" (Philippians 2:12).

The Word of God provides the road map to take us from the here-and-now to heaven. It provides the recipe we need to live quality, overcoming, victorious, joyous, and peace-filled lives.

Life Reflection:

We have studied the character of God. (See *The Keys to Answered Prayer, Lesson 1.*) How do I use the Bible to find out what He expects of me?

Various verses of Scripture reveal glimpses of God's desire for our lives. Taken together we see the whole picture. It is possible to take a certain scripture in isolation and develop a skewed view of God and what He expects. In Isaiah 28:10, we are advised to gather and glean truth from the entire Word of God. Taken in context and balance we are safe from the traps of the enemy.

"For precept must be upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, and there a little" (Isaiah 28:10).

Some people ask God for direction, close their eyes, open their Bible, and place their finger on a scripture. Confident they have divine instruction, they are willing to comply with whatever that particular verse says. But what if a hurting person randomly opened the Bible and read the account of Judas hanging himself? (See Matthew 27:5.)

If we have studied God's Word, we know God promises hope for wounded hearts, "Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world" (Matthew 28:20) and "I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee" (Hebrews 13:5).

Life Reflection:

Am I reluctant to discover what God requires of me?

Life Reflection:

Do I read God's Word with understanding?

While Christ told parables in the New Testament to hide His message from the skeptics and unbelievers, those who believed on Him understood.

Isaiah prophesied about the coming kingdom long before Jesus walked on earth.

"And an highway shall be there, and a way, and it shall be called The way of holiness; the unclean shall not pass over it; but it shall be for those: the wayfaring men, though fools, shall not err therein" (Isaiah 35:8).

The gospel—the Word of God is simple enough that a child can understand. Let me give you an example of the clarity you will find when you seek God's will for your life:

"He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" (Micah 6:8).

In one verse we are told three things God requires. We are to do the "right thing" and be merciful and humble as we walk with God. That isn't complicated, is it? This one Scripture addresses our relationships, character, actions, thoughts, and words.

Life Reflection:

Why is God so concerned about my relationship with other people? I'm okay with Him, isn't that all that matters?

Life Reflection:

I want God to answer my prayers. How do I gain His approval and blessings?

Obedience to God's Word and an honest heart releases God's blessings into our lives. Below are several Scriptures that reveal His expectations. I suggest you add to this list as you read His Word.

- 1. "Give unto the LORD the glory due unto his name; worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness" (Psalm 29:2).
- 2. "Pray without ceasing. In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you" (I Thessalonians 5:17-18).
- 3. "If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land" (II Chronicles 7:14).
